(1)	FY 2011 BUDGETED and FY 2012 ENACTED require that at least 30% of workforce development funds be recommended by the Workforce Departmental Review Committee for programs in the 23 counties with the highest unemployment rates in the state; these programs are not subject to review and approval by the State Workforce Planning Council.
(2)	FY 2011 BUDGETED requires that not less than 50% of Career Tech funds be used for Agriscience purposes; the remainder will be expended by the Superintendent of Education for other career tech programs; FY 2012 ENACTED requires that at least \$900,000 of Career Tech funds be used for Agriscience purposes, with the remainder expended for other career tech programs.
